What to Pack:

Note: Trekking gear and equipment can be purchased in Nepal though they may be knock off brands. Weather in April will be warm, with only a few cold days as we near base camp. It is unlikely that we will experience any rain, but a rain poncho can be purchased for cheap in Kathmandu for an ease of mind.

☐ Water Purification Tablets (can be purchased in KTM)

Anti-diarrhea Pills
Anti-altitude Sickness Pills (Diamox or Acetazolamide)
Anti-headache Pills or Essential Oil
☐ Electrolytes
Stomach Antibiotic (Ciprofloxacin)

☐ 1 Small Roll of Repair Tape
☐ 1 Sewing-Repair Kit
